What happened on this board?
Looks like a boring 6H contract but look at the Datums. . .
Datum = With seven tables the top and bottom scores are excluded and the arithmetic mean is taken. Sounds like the average but it's not.

In the Open: Datum is $+820 \mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$
In the Women's: Datum was +800
This board offers all sorts of temptations late in the tournament when players are tired and some pairs start 'punting' to try to pick up imps.

If $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$ are playing the type of Multi 2D which shows $8-11$ and both majors then East might open 2D. West will get very excited and hit the accelerator via RKB. Some desperate South's might open a very free wheeling 2NT multi showing both minors and now E/W will do well to get to 6 H .

If $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{W}$ are playing a big club system and the bidding has gone pass, pass, then, if $\mathrm{N} / \mathrm{S}$ pass throughout, a good system should detect the gaps and stop in 6H.

If E/W are playing a 'natural' system the opening bid could be $1 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{NT}$ or some sort of strong 2C or 2D opening bid. Unless E/W have the right collection of gadgets, it will be difficult to determine whether East's passed hand values are the right collection to go to 7 H .

A sensible middle of the road auction could be -1 H from West, 4D (splinter) from East and 6 H from West or perhaps RKB for aces then 6H when the HQ is found to be missing.

Some West's will have found that they have 10 hearts between them (missing the $Q$ ) and all 5 aces and have a punt at 7 H .

Being the second last round and this being the eighth day of the tournament for most pairs, everyone is tired. West may think 'everyone' will be in 6 H and needing to notch up a strong win, they punt the grand slam hoping to gain 10-12 imps, even though they can't count 13 tricks as recommended in the textbooks.

So what did happen?
OPEN: $\quad 7 \mathrm{H}$ bid 3 times (all failing)
6 H bid four times (12 tricks)
WOMENS: 6H 4 times (faling once)
6DW!! down 5 tricks
4H twice (12 tricks)
Its a tough life in these Butler events. If you were N/S and your opponents bid and made this boring looking

6 H , you drop 12 imps .
Its not fair is it. . . AARGH.\#\%®@ !!
