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## reflection

I think that the treatment of hand 15 from the 2004 Butler Stage II Round 14 (the last round) may be of interest to the bulletin readers.

S was dealer (NS vul):

The bidding proceeded 1H, 3C (alerted), 3D (explained as natural and forcing). My partner's 3C bid showed a 2 suited hand with spades and diamonds (at least 5,5). Should I double or not? The opponents obviously had

a huge heart fit, so I just bid 4S. South enquired about the 3C bid, then doubled. His partner removed to 5H and I bid 5S again doubled by south. South cashed the Ace of hearts and then gave me a heart ruff. I lead the Q

of spades which south ducked and north showed out. The opponent's hands were now obviously:

Certainly they were something very similar as indicated from the bidding.

So, if I took a diamond finesse, I was going two off, losing a heart, diamond king a diamond ruff and another spade. However if south had a diamond and I gave one up, I was only going one off. So I played a diamond to the Ace, returned a club to my Ace, ruffed a club (overruffing the spade 10 with A), then played the Q of diamonds and nearly fell off my chair when it lost to south. I had turned a making contract into a losing one, going off one as I intended. We ended up one VP off the pace for the next stage to my husband's great delight. Having only played bridge three times this year he was already bridged out and needing a holiday.

He then eliminates the diamonds, finesses the heart queen, wins the forced heart return and leads the heart three. He discards one club loser on this and another on the "ruff & sluff" given by the forced heart return.

No wonder he left town after missing that counter coup. After all he has a complete count of the hand in the end game.
