Here's a bidding problem faced by Cathy Mill, reported by Rena Kaplan:

2♣ was game force, 2♦ negative. Mill thought grand slam was still a chance. (Opposite the actual West hand it's on 3-3 clubs or the heart finesse) One thought is to bid 5♠ to show that the splinter was in fact a void. Or maybe just give up on the grand and bid 6♦.

Thing is, partner had agonised for a full minute before bidding $5 \pm$. Why? May she needed to work out whether $4 \pm$ was a cue agreeing diamonds, or natural – weak with a 7-card suit.

That seems to make it very risky for Mill to bid 5 but that's exactly what she did! As she feared, 5 was passed out but she had done the right thing. Partner's long pause suggested that $6\diamond$ was prudent, so Mill was legally and ethically bound to try 5 d.
