 $Q \triangleq$  was led, won by the Ace, and a small spade was played to the king, West pitching a heart.

Declarer tried the A $\triangleq$  to endplay West, but West played the K $\triangleq$  under the A $\triangleq$ . Still hoping, declarer continued a  $\clubsuit$ , East won the Q $\triangleq$  over dummy's ] $\clubsuit$ .

East should now return a spade to kill the hand but chose the heart. This let South cross ruff the rest of his four trumps but after the early play by West had to lose 2 clubs, I heart and I diamond.



The 2 $\bigstar$  was led, taken by declarer. The 9 $\bigstar$  was tabled, and after some thought, the K was played. Questions about singletons and no trump opening were asked. Declarer's ultimate fantasy was fulfilled when the Q $\bigstar$  was played by West and East's 10 came crashing down. Making 12! And we can only say that after 7 full days of bridge (enjoyable though it may have been) cashing the setting trick seemed attractive.
