

**A Senior Experience** The following was offered anonymously (to protect the innocent, ostensibly) – for board 17 of Round 3 (ACT vs NT, Seniors).

The bidding (it was observed) went:

North	East	South	West
Pass	Pass	1D	1H
Pass	Pass	х	All pass

The full hand was:



The play went as follows:

- 1. N started with the  $\blacklozenge$  K taken by the ace.
- 2. A Q went to the king.
- South cashed the ♣A then switched to ♦ 8, 6, Q, 4.
- 4. North cashed the ♣K, then played another for S to ruff.
- South cashed the ▲A and led another but West impatiently ruffed in.
- West's trump lead was won by ♥J, and N continued with the ♦7, ruffed by West.
- 7. West's ♥K was ducked, and N claimed the remaining tricks.

The outcome was 3 off, for 500.

It was only after the match was over that North revealed to everyone that she had *actually opened 1NT, but none of the other players had noticed.*
