

Today's Bid of the day was offered by Roger Watts for deal 7 of Round 7 of the Interstate Teams. Our Bridge Correspondent thinks you will all remember it well -



At Roger's table the bidding went -

North	East	South	West
		Pass	3S
5D	6S	Pass	Pass
7C	All pass		

7C undoubled, one off was an excellent result for NS as at other tables (your Bridge Correspondent has learned) EW played in 7S (making when a diamond wasn't led), 6S or 5SX. Commonly North overcalled 4NT for the minors, so 7C was a very reasonable sacrifice over 6S.

Dunning-Kruger effect

Taken from Wikipedia, Grant Kilvington (the old fart in the Vic Youth team) thinks that this may strike a chord with many people.

Forgive the technical terminology, or ask Kate Smith (WA Women's Captain) for a crash course in shrink talk.

The **Dunning–Kruger effect** is a cognitive bias in which unskilled individuals suffer from illusory superiority, mistakenly rating their ability much higher than average. This bias is attributed to a metacognitive inability of the unskilled to recognize their mistakes. Actual competence may weaken self-confidence, as competent individuals may falsely assume that others have an equivalent understanding. As Kruger and Dunning conclude, "the miscalibration of the incompetent stems from an error about the self, whereas the miscalibration of the highly competent stems from an error about others".
