Celebrating 40 Years of BAWA

Roll of Honour

In every organization there are always a few people that stand out because of what they do. All too often their efforts go unrecognized.

In 2003 the BAWA Outstanding Service Award was endorsed and the following was decreed:

"The Award honours members who have devoted a considerable amount of their time and expertise in promoting and supporting bridge in WA generally, as opposed to just their home club".

In the first year of the Award, BAWA took the special step of honouring three recipients posthumously:

- Hans G Rosendorff
- Mike Hopper
- Gwen Johnson

Since then, the Recognition of Outstanding Service Award has been granted to only two members:

- 2003: Lii Soots
- 2004: Derek Pocock

In this year of the ANC and 40 anniversary of BAWA, we would like to revisit with you the story of these special people.



Hans G Rosendorff could be considered the 'Father of Bridge' in WA. His belief that bridge is fostered by strong competition led him, in 1955, to start campaigning for interstate bridge. He captained the first team to compete for

WA in the SA Congress in 1958. By 1967 he was WA's representative on the ABF Council, and along with Mike Hopper, pushed for an independent State body. Hans was selected by BAWA as a truly worthy name to head the Outstanding Service Honour Board.

Eddie Kantar (Bridge Tips)

Mike Hopper, who sadly died in the year of the Awards inception, was responsible for many of the changes in WA Bridge over the last four decades. In addition to helping Kalamunda Bridge Club grow and prosper, Mike was the driving force behind the concept and establishment of BAWA: a State Association independent of any individual club. He was also a Director of note for many years, and successfully oversaw the Pennants and Teams of 4 competitions that are still running to this day

Gwen Johnson, who sadly also died the same year, had such a love of the game that she eventually went on to teach at the Perth Bridge Club as well as at Mt Lawley TAFE. She helped to establish clubs at Dianella, Esperance, Kalgoorlie and the YWCA where she also taught and directed. In 1976 she was appointed as the BAWA Promotions Officer travelling the State helping to promote bridge in Albany, Busselton, Bunbury, Mandurah, Geraldton and Kalgoorlie. Gwen was not only involved in bridge, but also supported a wide range of different activities. In 2001 Gwen was awarded the Order of Australia for her contribution to the community. In 2003 she was awarded BAWA's Recognition of Outstanding Service.



Lii Soots *"This Award is given in recognition of more than three decades of supporting the bridge community in WA by guiding directors at all levels, running the state-wide Pennants competition, creating and maintaining the Masterpoint register for WA, and in particular for your considerable assistance to Clubs with directing, dealing boards, Matchpointing their competitions and helping them process their Masterpoints. Through your dedication you have done much to foster bridge in WA".* - This was the citation on the BAWA Recognition of Outstanding Service Award presented to Lii Soots in 2003. The award honoured a wonderful woman who has given much to bridge in Western Australia.



Derek Pocock *"This Award is given in recognition of 30 years of unstinting service to the Bridge community of WA. Your creation of the Leagues Competition which you have supported since its inception in 1975, and which you have run*

for most of that time, coupled with nearly 30 years of service as an office bearer for BAWA has been an outstanding achievement and has contributed significantly to fostering Bridge in WA" - This was the citation on the BAWA Recognition of Outstanding Service Award presented to Derek Pocock in 2004. The award honours a very fine gentleman who has done, and continues to do much to foster bridge in WA.

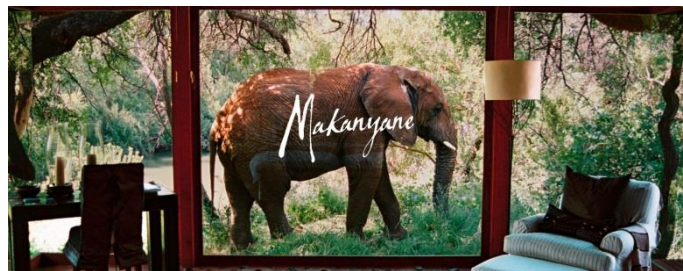
