When you play Phil Markey and Justin Williams be prepared for situations not likely to be faced at the other tables. On board 15 with NS vulnerable Justin as South opens 1NT (9-14). I hold:

- ♠ KT83
- ♥ 65
- ♦ AJ865
- ♣ AK

Enough to double (just). Phil redoubles (on enquiry, to play), followed by two passes. Are you a chicken or a he-man? Put me in the first category, and a retreat to 2D results in +110 and a flat board. The he-man around would have collected 1600!!!

CQ lead.

I won, cashed HK and played a low S to the 9. That won but I then discovered that hearts were 5-1. I continued Hs and gave south a H trick, who returned a C to my K. At this point I thought I had no real chance and just played a S to the A which resulted in 1 off. Very lazy as I could have still made. All I had to do was cash DA pitching a low C and THEN cross to the SA. When I cash the last H, I discard my C10 and North is caught in a simple black suit squeeze so either the C8 or S10 will score the 12th trick. 13 imps out instead of 13 in when they were in 3NT at the other table.

Deep Finesse doesn't make 6NT though. After the CQ lead when I play a low S, North needs to insert the Q. This destroys the 2nd spade entry to dummy that is needed for the squeeze to work. It's a play right out of the text books but how many would find it at the table?!

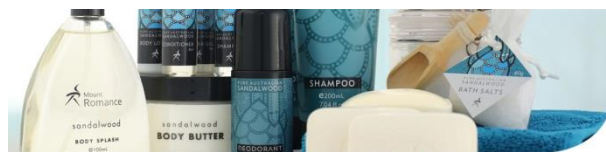

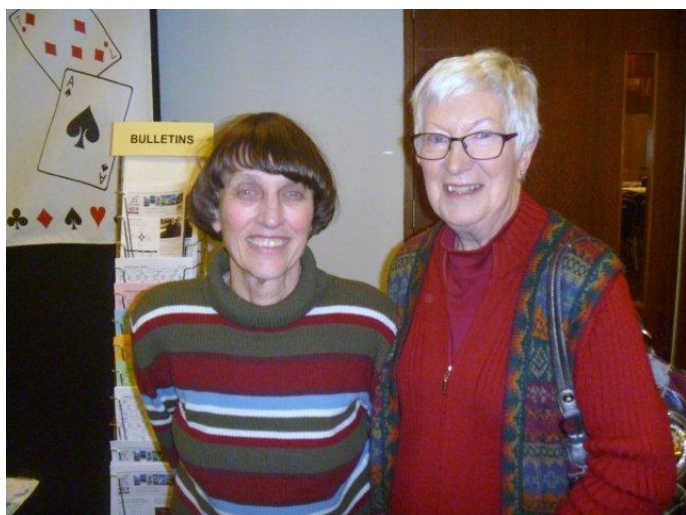

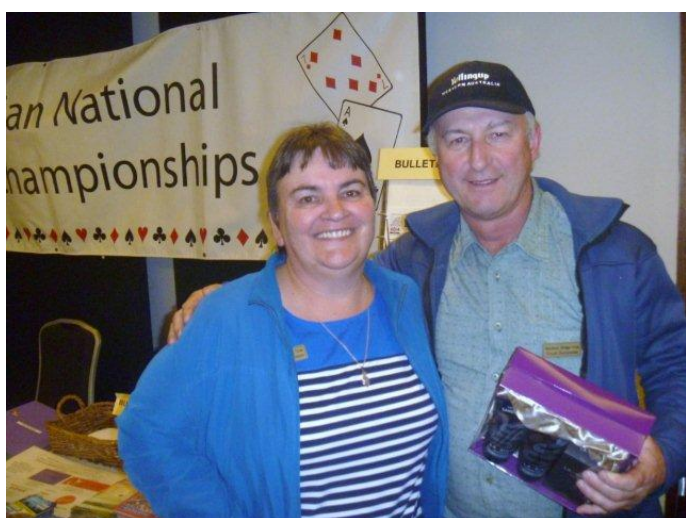
