A few changes


The new event is the Seniors' Pairs, at the GCI. Remember, all Senior and Restricted events are at the GCI.

Canadians also did well in the recent NEC Cup in Tokyo, losing narrowly to the "English" team of Brian Senior, John Armstrong, Pablo Lambardi and Brian Callaghan.
