Systems Regulations

All events at the 2000 Summer Festival will be subject to the ABF Systems Regulations, as amended to 1st May, 1998. There are four categories of system coded by colour.

- **GREEN** Natural systems. May include Benjamin-style 2C and 2D openings.
- **BLUE** Strong club systems, e.g. Precision, Blue Club; systems where 1C shows one of several types of hand, e.g. Power, Polish Club. May include European Multi-2D, with one option being a weak two in either major.
- **RED** Systems, otherwise GREEN or BLUE, which include HIGHLY ARTIFICIAL CONVENTIONS, e.g.
 - (a) An opening bid at the two or three level which is weak and does not specifically identify at least one suit.
 - (b) An opening bid which shows a 4.4.1 distribution of <17 HCP with an unspecified singleton, or a 5.4.4.0 distribution of <16 HCP with an unspecified void.
 - (c) Opening bids of 1H or 1S which promise at least four cards in a suit other than that named by the bid.
 - (d) An opening bid of 1NT which shows neither a balanced hand (where balanced means no singleton or void, no 6-card or longer major suit, or no 7-card or longer minor suit), nor an unbalanced hand of 17+ HCP.
 - (e) Radical change of method according to position or vulnerability.

YELLOW Systems which comprise HIGHLY UNUSUAL METHODS, e.g.

- (a) A strong or intermediate pass in opening position.
- (b) An opening bid at the one or two level which in principle is as weak as pass and which makes no positive statement as to distribution.
- (c) An opening bid at the one level which has more than one potential meaning (may show length or shortage in the suit named, or may be two-suited with neither suit specified).
- (d) Non-descriptive or "random" overcalls.

YELLOW systems may, subject to the conditions specified in their Supplementary Regulations, only be used in the South-West PacificTeams, the National Open Teams and the National Womens Teams.

RED systems may be used in all events at the Summer Festival but pairs playing a RED system must revert to a GREEN or BLUE system when drawn to play against a Protected Pair in those events where protection applies: i.e. the National 0-149 Teams and all pairs events other than the Final of Australian Open Pairs. GREEN and BLUE systems may be used in all events.

PROTECTED PAIR STATUS. A pair, playing a GREEN system throughout a pairs event at the Summer Festival, which has both of its players below National Master or one player below Local Master may apply to the Chief Tournament Director to be a PROTECTED PAIR identified by a BROWN sticker on the front of its system card for that event. Pairs playing RED systems must ascertain before the start of each round whether their opponents are a PROTECTED PAIR. If so, the pair playing the RED system must revert to a GREEN or a BLUE system for that round. Coloured stickers are available from Directors prior to each session.

SYSTEM DISCLOSURE. YELLOW: Pairs wishing to use a YELLOW system must submit a concise summary, typed or written in black ink on an ABF Standard or a WBF system card plus a maximum of two supplementary A4 sheets, to the Convener on or before 5.1.2000.

The onus rests with all pairs to classify their systems appropriately. A copy of the ABF Systems Regulations is available from the Convener.

A Swiss teams qualifying stage with six teams progressing to stage 2. Stage 2 is a round robin of 14-board matches to qualify two teams for the final.

A win in the qualifying stage will earn 1.2 gold points for each player in a team of four.

Qualification for 2001 Zone 7 Championships

Teams filling the first four places in the NWT and in first place after the qualifying rounds will earn Playoff Qualifying Points. Lower placed teams will receive qualifying points if ineligible teams fill any of these places.

National 0-149 Teams Championship

Each player must have less than 150 masterpoints as at 30/9/1999

Players from overseas are not eligible Categories 0-49, 0-99 and 0-149.

12-14 January, 8 sessions, Rydges Canberra Hotel

Session times Wed, Thu 11.00, 3.00, 8.30; Fri 11.00, 3.00 ENTRY FEE: \$320 per team (4, 5 or 6 players)

Players in this event will play the same boards as the National Womens Teams. There will be only one field in this event. Matches may pair teams from different categories. A win will earn about two thirds of a gold point for each player in a team of four. The winner of the 0-149 Teams Championship is awarded the Trumps Trophy. The leading teams in the categories 0-49 and 0-99 are awarded Perpetual Salvers. All winners receive medallions.

National Seniors Teams Championship

All players in a team must have been born before 1/1/1945 12-14 January, Hyatt Hotel Canberra Final on 15 January, Rydges Canberra Hotel 9 qualifying sessions then a final

Session times 11.00, 3.00, 8.30 Final on Saturday 10.00,12.00, 3.00 & 5.00 ENTRY FEE: \$360 per team (4,5 or 6 players) Categories: Womens, Veterans, Country and Mixed (see p6 for definitions).

Players in this event will play the same boards as the National Womens Teams. A win in this Swiss teams event will earn 1.2 gold points for each player in a team of four. The final will be played over four sessions of 14 boards. The winning team will be awarded the Electronic Bridge Accessories Bowl. The leading teams in the categories are awarded Perpetual Salvers.

At the request of the ABF and the managements of the Hyatt Hotel Canberra, the National Convention Centre and Rydges Canberra Hotel, we ask entrants to observe the following standards:

Males: No bare feet, no thongs, no tank tops, no hats, no tracksuits; shorts should be accompanied by long socks.

Females: No bare feet, no thongs, no brief shorts.

Masterpoints

Gold Masterpoints: National Womens Teams, National 0-149 Teams, National Seniors Teams, Australian Mens Pairs, Australian Open Pairs, National Swiss Pairs, South-West Pacific Teams, National Open Teams, Australian Mixed Teams.

Red Masterpoints: Australian Mixed Pairs, Walk-In Pairs, Flighted Pairs, Bridge Buffs Open Teams.

Smoking

ACT law prohibits any smoking areas within any of the venues. Smokers will have to go outdoors to light up.

Student Discount

Players under the age of 26 at 1/1/2000 who are fulltime students receive a 50% rebate on their entry fees to all events at the Summer Festival.

To claim this rebate you will need to produce your current (1999 or 2000) student identification card at the Summer Festival desk in Rydges Canberra Hotel.

Conditions of Entry

Persons applying to enter the Summer Festival of Bridge should be aware of the following:

- 1. The Sponsoring Organisation for the Summer Festival of Bridge is the Australian Bridge Federation Incorporated (ABF).
- 2. The ABF, under its tournament regulations, reserves the right to decline to accept entries to any event conducted by it in its absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor.
- **3.** Subject always to the above, the following conditions will apply to the National Womens Teams and the South-West Pacific Teams:
 - (a) No entry will be regarded as complete unless an entry form has been submitted and entry fees paid for each player.
 - (b) Entries will be processed in order of receipt of complete entry forms.
 - (c) The closing date for entries is 5/1/2000 and any entry not complete by that date will not be considered unless there is still room available in the field.
 - (d) The ABF in its absolute discretion may reserve places in the field for teams that might be considered to have the capacity to represent Australia in international events.
- 4. As soon as reasonably possible after any application for entry has been declined, the entrant will be notified of that fact and the entry fee returned. In these circumstances the decision of the ABF must be final and no correspondence or debate shall be entered into.
- 5. Australian resident players must be current financial members of the ABF Masterpoint Scheme.
- 6. All players in events restricted by masterpoints must be qualified as at 30/9/1999.
- 7. All session times in this brochure are provisional and may be altered by the organisers as necessary to ensure the smooth running of the event.
- 8. Mobile phones must be switched off whilst in the playing area.

Completing the Entry Form

- * It is vital, when filling out your entry form, to include your given name, ABF or NZCBA Number, address and the name (or number) of your Home Club. Players providing all of this information will be placed on the mailing list for the 2001 brochure.
- New tournament players or players from overseas should write "new player" or "overseas" in the space for ABF or NZCBA Number.
- * If you enter the SWPT and have a preference, don't forget to specify at which venue you wish to play. Remember that space at the Rydges Canberra Hotel is limited.
- * Please provide a contact phone number when entering using a credit card or when entering a Teams event. In the latter case your team captain's telephone number will suffice.
- * All fees must accompany entries, no telephone entries will be accepted. Fees paid by credit card are only considered received when cleared by the credit provider. If your details are not accepted by the credit provider we will contact you by telephone.
- * Receipts will be mailed only if a stamped, self-address envelope is enclosed with your entry.
