You are vulnerable, your opponents are not. I know that there is a school of thought that favours opening 1♣ on such a hand if playing natural methods. I prefer to open 24 (game force).

However, regardless of what you open, LHO overcalls 3^(weak), partner doubles (negative you think - it is mixed teams!) and RHO raises to 7♡!

Your move.

Your instinct tells you to double and accept whatever penalty

comes your way. If partner has two aces and nothing else, for example, then 7 may have no play. But don't you hate it when at long last you get a hand that is half way decent and you are forced to defend. It is your choice.
