East opened 3♦ against me. Being an optimist, I bid 4♥. Unfortunately this propelled us into 6♥. However, the play's the thing: J♣ lead, won with the Ace. A club ruff brought down the King. Next I led a small diamond; East was giggling when West ruffed with Q♥! She drew another round of trumps and exited with a small club which meant the remaining tricks were mine. – 100 was a flat board (I'm not sure what happened at the other table but 4♥ went one light).

Now I've had time to look more closely, 3◊X only goes two off (300) if East gets the spade trick in. (2 hearts, 1 spade and 4 diamonds – look at the pips!).

The play was routine; after drawing trumps, two rounds of diamonds set up the suit without even the need to ruff. 13 IMPS to the good guys, which won the match for us.

At the time, Shirley guessed that on this bidding I must hold the $\heartsuit K$. On subsequent reflection she realised that a jump straight to 4NT after the opening bid would have revealed $\bigstar A$ and $\heartsuit K$ precisely, and the second king that was needed to guarantee 13 tricks. Ah, well, no one's perfect!

The opening lead was ducked in Dummy, North playing the $\bigstar K$ and East the $\bigstar J$.

North now switched to the ♦8, South winning with ♦T when Declarer played low.

South now played the ♠7 which knocked out the table's only spade stopper. The ♡K was led

and this trick was captured by South's \heartsuit A.

South realised that North must have all the rest of the spades and so led the $\bigstar 2$.

When the smoke cleared, declarer was squeezed on the run of the spades. He foolishly discarded a diamond from the table, as did South.

After cashing the spades, North returned the ◊7, EW ended up -500 making only 4 tricks.

At the other table, EW played in 3♣ for -200, translating into +300 for our team or 7 IMPs.
