Format - South West Pacific Teams / National Open Teams

The South West Pacific Teams (SWPT) is the major event in the 2nd week of the Summer Festival in Canberra in January. It currently runs from Monday to Friday over 14 rounds of 20 boards. The leading teams qualify to a finals series, called the National Open Teams (NOT). The NOT currently commences on Friday night, immediately after the SWPT, and ends in a 64 board final on the next Monday.

Over the years the ABF tournament committee has received a number of suggestions and tried a number of different formats for the NOT. There have been very few changes to the format of the SWPT.

The aim of this survey is to determine if the format of the SWPT and the NOT meet the needs of the tournament bridge playing public. Please return your submission including your ABF number to be eligible for a prize to be drawn on Friday 22nd January, 2010.

	 Notes on this format: There would be four 40-board knockout matches, played in 2 x 20-board hall same session times and boards as the Swiss. Teams that lose in round 1, 2 or 3 of the knock-out would rejoin the Swiss, rethe field. Teams that lose in round 4 of the knock-out would qualify to a repechage final and Saturday morning (of 32 boards) against the top 4 teams after round 14 of the Staturday of 48 boards would be followed by Semi Final (Sund (Monday) of 64 boards each.
