## Player Survey

## Format - South West Pacific Teams / National Open Teams

The South West Pacific Teams (SWPT) is the major event in the $2^{\text {nd }}$ week of the Summer Festival in Canberra in January. It currently runs from Monday to Friday over 14 rounds of 20 boards. The leading teams qualify to a finals series, called the National Open Teams (NOT). The NOT currently commences on Friday night, immediately after the SWPT, and ends in a 64 board final on the next Monday.

Over the years the ABF tournament committee has received a number of suggestions and tried a number of different formats for the NOT. There have been very few changes to the format of the SWPT.

$\square \quad$ Current Swiss format. 14 rounds of 20 boards from Monday to Friday. (As now, the NOT would start on Friday night).
$\square \quad$ Current format with 2 fewer Swiss matches (plus a 1 day event on Friday). 12 rounds of 20 boards from Monday to Thursday. A new one day Swiss Pairs/Teams would be introduced on Friday. (This would allow the NOT to commence on Friday morning).

Knock-Out with Swiss Repechage. The SWPT will be a 14 round Swiss.

00000 After 2 days ( 6 matches) the top 64 teams qualify to a knock-out section, starting on Wednesday. The Swiss continues alongside the knock-out for another 8 matches (14 in total).

Notes on this format:

- There would be four 40-board knockout matches, played in $2 \times 20$-board halves, with the same session times and boards as the Swiss.
- Teams that lose in round 1,2 or 3 of the knock-out would rejoin the Swiss, near the top of the field.
- Teams that lose in round 4 of the knock-out would qualify to a repechage final on Friday night and Saturday morning (of 32 boards) against the top 4 teams after round 14 of the SWPT Swiss.
- The Quarter Final (Saturday) of 48 boards would be followed by Semi Final (Sunday) and Final (Monday) of 64 boards each. Maximum number of boards per day $=64$.
