Dear bridge players

Welcome to the 41st Summer Festival of Bridge. We are once again back at Rydges Lakeside the original home of the Summer Festival.

In 2013 five new events have been introduced – 0-20 Super Novice Pairs and Teams, The Chris Diment Pairs, The Festival Teams and category finals for the South-West Pacific Teams.

The Super Novice events introduce our newest tournament players to the Summer Festival and are played at the same time as the Seniors, Womens and Restricted Teams events.

The Chris Diment Pairs will be a match-point pair's event played in honour of a great friend of bridge. The event will be barometer scored for three of the four sessions. It will be an exciting new event in which to be involved.

The Festival Teams is a one-day teams' event following the South-West Pacific Teams - a relaxing day following the main event. At the same time as the Festival teams the newly introduced category finals of the South-West Pacific Teams will be played. In previous years the leading team in each category was awarded the category trophy. In 2013 the leading two teams in each category will play a 32-board final to determine the category winner - a more exciting conclusion to the main event. These category finals will play the same boards as the Quarter Finals of the National Open Teams.

To make your stay in Canberra complete, the Festival bus will also be transporting players to various tourist attractions around and just outside Canberra. Details are in the daily bulletins.

Also each morning Colin and Patricia Beaton will be taking guided walks around various parts of Lake Burley Griffin and the city. These walks leave each morning at 6.30am from Rydges Lakesdide. More details in this and each daily bulletin.

It's going to be an exciting and event packed Summer Festival!



Tim Bourke's Problem - Solution

On the bidding, you should place West with the ace of hearts. Then, after ruffing the king of clubs and drawing the outstanding trump, the contract may seem to depend on the diamond finesse. However, there is an extra chance that West holds a doubleton diamond. Suppose the full deal is:



As you expect West to have at most two diamonds, the play that wins against any distribution is to a ruff a heart, ruff dummy's last club, cash the ace of diamonds and ruff

The courtesy Bus will leave the first accommodation site 90 minutes before play

begins and will return after play. It is approximately 5 minutes between

a second heart. Next comes a diamond, playing the queen when East follows low. Here, West takes your queen with his king of diamonds but has no safe exit card. If West exits with a club, you will throw your remaining diamond from table and take the ruff in hand. If West plays a heart no matter whether he plays the ace of hearts or a low one, you will make a trick with the king of hearts and discard dummy's last diamond on it.

An alternative solution that also wins whenever West has the ace of hearts is to win the trump shift in hand and ruff a heart. After crossruffing clubs and hearts over the next four tricks, cross back to hand with a trump and lead the king of hearts to West's ace, discarding a diamond from table. West has to concede an extra trick no what he plays; if he plays a diamond then you have two diamond tricks and if he plays club or a heart you will throw a diamond from table

and ruff in hand with your last trump. After cashing the ace of diamonds, dummy will have only two trumps left and will be high.

(You should give yourself a pat on the back if you found both solutions.)
