AUSTRALIA AT THE PARIS 2001 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS #3

Summary: Our Open Team has won two matches but is still amongst the cellar dwellers. Rounds 9 and 11 will be the last "easy" matches for our Open Team. Our Women have lost badly to the two late entrants (France and Israel) but have performed well otherwise. They are 19 VPs from qualifying (top eight). Both our Open and Women's teams play the bottom team in Round 9, but the bottom Open team Hong Kong did beat the then-leaders USA2 in Round 8.

News: There's expected to be no online Vugraph until the Semi-Finals (see Note 3 below), when e-bridge should have Vugraph. My guess is that the problem's that Eric Kokish, who usually organises online Vugraph, is instead doing the on-site Vugraph. The venue - the Stade de France - is a National Monument with a fee of 10,000 francs for a picture of it, so there are no pictures of the venue in the Daily Bulletins. Argentina's leading pair - Pablo Ravenna who came 2nd in the 2000 Gold Coast Teams & his 14 year old partner Agustin Madala - apparently took 32 minutes to play the first two boards against Bocchi-Duboin of Italy, who won the 2001 NOT. The Director was called and play sped up.
