AUSTRALIA AT THE PARIS 2001 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS #4 (after 12 matches)

Summary: A change of line-up has seen our Open Team's fortunes improve dramatically and we are now only 9.1 VPs from qualifying (top eight) and only 14.1 VPs from 6th place. George Bilski and Terry Brown top the datums (see Note 1 below) after having their first match together in Round 9. A stunning maximum win over Indonesia (ranked 4th in the world) in Round 12 will be followed by matches against two of the leaders in Rounds 13 and 14. However, our Women's chances have vanished; they are 41 VPs from qualifying.

News: There is no online Vugraph until the Semi-Finals (see Note 5 below). Thursday's Bulletin #4 includes the hands from the Australian Women's loss to Israel - alas all the swings were to Israel.
