### REGULATIONS

System and Alerting Regulations for ABF Events apply to the Sydney Spring Nationals and can be found on the ABF Website <u>www.abf.com.au.</u> Supplementary regulations for the Sydney Spring Nationals will be posted on the ABF Website in October 2005.

All pairs must supply their opponents with two (2) ABF Standard system cards completed legibly and adequately to disclose their system.

All systems and conventions, including those categorised as YELLOW, are permitted in the Open and Womens Teams in all rounds and at all levels. Pairs in any doubt about the classification of their system should submit a concise summary to the Convener.

Teams containing a pair registering a YELLOW system lose seating rights in the qualifying rounds.

Pairs intending to use a YELLOW system must lodge with the Convener by November 7, 2005:

- an adequate system statement on a WBF or ABF Standard system card plus a maximum of 2 supplementary A4 sheets
- a suggested defence to the HUM aspects of the system

Pairs intending to use a YELLOW system only against an opposing pair playing a YELLOW system must lodge with the Chief Tournament Director before the start of the first round of the event in which they wish to use it:

- an adequate system statement on a WBF or ABF Standard system card plus a maximum of 2 supplementary A4 sheets
- a suggested defence to the HUM aspects of the system

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

Persons applying to enter the Sydney Spring Nationals should be aware of the following:

- 1. The Sponsoring Organisation (The Australian Bridge Federation) reserves the right to refuse admission to any entry which includes a player who does not qualify under the Conditions of Contest or who is not in good standing with any registered bridge club, bridge association or the Sponsoring Organisation.
- No entry will be regarded as complete unless an entry form has been submitted before the closing date, Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2005, with (a) full entry fees paid, and ABF numbers supplied, and (b) All players resident in Australia must be current financial members of the ABF Masterpoint Scheme.
- 3. Players born after 31/12/1980 receive a 50% rebate on their entry fees to all events at the Sydney Spring Nationals. Send a photocopy of your proof of age document with your entry form and deduct the rebate from the total fee payable.
- 4. All session times in this brochure are provisional and may be altered by the organisers as necessary to ensure the smooth running of the event. It is the responsibility of players to ascertain the starting times of the sessions and rounds from the times announced by the Director and posted on the notice board.
- 5. Mobile phones and other means of electronic communication must be switched off whilst in the playing area.

#### HAKOAH CLUB

Players are required to observe dress regulations, being those applicable to the Hakoah Club. In addition, all players, as visitors to the Club, will be required to sign-in each day.
