West led the 4: nine – king – ace. South cashed the 4Q, ruffed a spade with the 8, crossed to the 4A, ruffed the fourth spade with the 10 and exited with the K. South lost two hearts and a club, North-South +620.

Lacking Jacek Pszczola's courage, South was influenced by the spade length and poor quality of the hearts and declined to overcall  $2^{\checkmark}$ . After a spade lead, declarer also made ten tricks, but that was +170 and a loss to those who were +620. South's only solace was that if West had led the  $^{\diamond}A$  against  $4^{\diamond}$  and continued with the  $^{\diamond}2$ , the limit for South would have been nine tricks and playing in  $3^{\diamond}$  would have been a pick-up.

This arose in a practice game on BBO:

North dealer : Nil vulnerable



At one table, with East-West silent, it went  $1 \ge 2 \forall$  (artificial, game-invitation with 4+ clubs). North bid  $3 \ge$ , all pass. Declarer lost three diamonds and a heart, but had nine tricks, +110.

At the other table, it went  $1 \neq 2$ : Pass : 1NT (6-11), all pass. West led the  $\forall Q$ . That could have been right on another day, but not this one. South won with the  $\forall K$  and cashed five clubs. East ditched spades and so South made 10 tricks, +180 and +2 Imps.

See the outcome if West happens to hit on the  $\diamond 2$  lead. East wins with the  $\diamond K$  and seeing that there will be four diamond tricks at best for the defence. East switches to hearts. Which one? The  $\forall 10$  as East has dummy's  $\forall 9$  surrounded with a full sequence. Now the defence should come to nine tricks to take 3NT five down!

Postscript: Whether North-South make  $3 \ge 0$  or make 1NT with overtricks or even go five light in 1NT, it would be a good result for them. Unable to enter the bidding, East-West can make  $4 \checkmark$  against any defence. They lose only two spades and a club.
