Any notable information, such as coming with spouse and children, can be provided in the Special Notifications blank. Besides, please kindly provide us with your past bridge achievements, as remarkable histories glorify the congress.

After collecting form 1 and 2 from your regional teams and pairs, every regional federation is required to sum up the total teams registration fees with **Form 3 and submit all three kinds of forms for a complete registration**. We sincerely appreciate your consideration and cooperation, as these registration processes are essential to our statistical process and to a more convenient registration.

In addition, PABF requires each Youth and Senior team member to provide his/her birth date for certification purpose.

### A Glance of Taiwan

We would like to invite you to experience the beauty of Taiwan from different angles during your visit.

1. Chiufen Village & Northeast Coast Tour (4 hrs, pm)



The villages of Chiufen were once centers of gold mining in Taiwan. The gold is gone, but these quaint old villages, built of closely-packed houses clinging to steep mountainsides, continue to offer enchanting scenery and fascinating glimpses into the lifestyles of the past.

The wave-buffeted geology of Taiwan's northern coastline finds one of its most unique and most celebrated manifestations. The white, yellow and brownish sandstone promontories here, directly in front of the pounding ocean, have been etched into all manner of artistic shapes by the weather and erosion.

### 2. Window on China (4 hrs, am)



Visit all of China's greatest architectural achievements in half day! The Miniature World Theme Park has thousands of miniature models of the most magnificent architectures and engineering marvels ever created in China and Taiwan. From spectacular ancient perspective to appreciate the artistry and history of Chinese architecture.



# 3. Taipei City Tour-- Dynasties of China (4 hrs, am/pm)



Plunge back in time and experience the entire 5000-year history of China with all its imperial intrigue and dynastic excesses; also see first hand the cultural metamorphosis of this most turbulent yet resilient civilization. A treasure on par with the Louve, the vaunted National Palace Museum is prized for its unmatched collection of priceless Chinese masterpieces and artifacts. From the earliest remnants of stone etched writings to miniature pagodas carved from pieces of silky jade stones to the actual quarters of emperors – the National Palace Museum's treasures exceed in scope and numbers of any collections in the world.

# 4. Wulai Aboriginal Village Tour (4 hrs, pm)



In the opposite direction from Taipei, the mountainous retreat of Wulai is popular for its Atayal aboriginal performances and for its hot springs. Beautiful scenery is formed by the high mountains and running rivers. It is said that Wulai is a term used by Tai Ya Tribe. It means The famous Wulai Waterfall is about hot spring. 80 meters high. It is magnificent like a white silk cloth coming down from the sky. In addition, the sightseeing trail train is part of the uniqueness of Wulai. Trail train used to be for transportation of lumber but now it is for tourists' pleasure. The aboriginal culture center across Wulai Waterfall is a remodeled museum of aboriginal folk art. The highlight of the visit to the center is the singing and dancing show of aboriginal people.



### 5. Folk Arts Tour (4 hrs, pm)



One of the oldest and best preserved Chinese temple in the world, San Hsia Tsushih Temple was built in 1769 and immediately became a shrine for worshippers and connoisseurs of architecture lovers of exquisite carvings. It is still in excellent condition after more than two centuries and many of the temple's details are still visible and all of its nuances appreciated.

### 6. 1-Day Taroko Gorge Tour



Taroko Gorge is one of the most spectacular natural wonders the world and Taiwan's foremost scenic attraction. The gorge is part of Taroko National Park which situated in the northeastern part of Taiwan, covers more than 92,000 hectares in the northern section of the Central Mountain The area is renowned for its lofty Range. mountains, deep canyons cutting off from the main gorge, head-spinning precipices, elegant waterfalls and raw wild rapids. The varied mountain peaks, numerous waterfalls, diverse plant forms and animal life, and the indigenous Atayal people together create the rich texture of this unique natural ecosystem.



# 7. 2-Day Tour to Sun Moon Lake, Puli & Lugang



Sun Moon Lake, located in the middle of Taiwan, with an elevation of 748 meters above sea level, is the only natural big lake in Taiwan. The old name for Sun Moon Lake was "Where water and sand meet". Entirely enfolded in mountains and dense tropical foliage, the lake takes the shape of a round sun when viewed form some of the surrounding hills, or of a crescent moon when seen from other perspectives. Under sunny skies, the dreamy landscape of turquoise waters, jade-green hills and drifting mountain mists lends itself well to the moods and passions of visitors.

Puli is known as the exact geographical center of the island. Puli is famous throughout Taiwan for the quality of its water and the beauty of its women. Due to the warm weather and

sweet, clear water that the Puli area of central Taiwan enjoys, the Puli Winery has come to be known for producing excellent quality Shaohsing Wine featuring a bright yellow appearance and a vigorous fragrance.

Lugang is situated on the west-central coast of Taiwan, at the edge of the coastal plain. Although once a harbor, severe silting of the sea and the Lugang River have left it some distance from the shore. The most fascinating aspect of Lugang is a number of ancient streets and lanes lined with old houses. The most unique of these are deep, narrow-fronted buildings that serve as stores and residences; this type of sky-lighted structure, however, can be seen today only at the Yuan Chang Shop on Chungshan Road, along Old Market Street, and at the Lugang Folk Arts Museum. Others, the half-old, the half-new shop residences along Chungshan road are products of the Japanese occupation period (1895-1945), when the front rooms of the buildings were dismantled because of a road-widening project and the modern arch-type facades were added.
