$2 \boldsymbol{*}=$ single suited $\$$, OR $\$$ canape, OR $5+/ 5+\geqslant \& \$$ strong
2\& $=5+/ 5+\&$ strong $2 N T=$ single suited OR canape
1NT can be 5422 and 6322 on minor minimum

## RCO Twos

Each shows a pair of 5/5 Suits
2H Rank Majors or Minors

2S Colour Reds or Blacks
2NT Odd Pointed or Rounded
Range is less than opening which is $6-10 \mathrm{HCP}$ in principle. May have slightly less Not Vul and slightly more Vul. In $4^{\text {th }}$ Seat the Weak Two range is $10-13 H C P$.
Over the RCO Twos, normal methods apply.
All Suit Bids correctable
2NT Asks over 2H/2S
