### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

The ABF, under its Tournament Regulations, reserves the right, in its absolute discretion and without assigning reason, to reject entries to any event conducted by it.

No entry for any event at the Spring Nationals Festival will be regarded as complete unless an entry form has been submitted with full entry fees paid for all members of the team, and all ABF numbers supplied.

Closing date for entries to the Spring National Open and Womens' Teams, is November 12<sup>th</sup>, 1999. Players from teams eliminated from the GNOT may enter the Congress Teams on the day, and their entry fees will be half of the standard.

GNOT entry is via State qualification only.

Teams which include player(s) involved in the concurrent final of the previous event will have the option of playing with substitute(s) on Day 1, or being included in the field on Day 2 with a score of 60 VPs.

Players must observe dress regulations: generally neat, clean and tidy: no thongs, no bare feet.

### FORMAT OF EVENTS

## **Spring National Congress Teams:**

These are 7-round Swiss events, with 8 boards per round, with a lunch break between rounds 3 and 4. Prize money is as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> \$400 2<sup>nd</sup> \$200 3<sup>rd</sup> \$100

## **Spring National Open Teams and Spring National Womens' Teams:**

These comprise 9x20-board qualifying rounds, 3 on each day. At the end of the qualifying rounds, the 2 leading teams will play a 64-board final.

### **PLAY-OFF POINTS**

Playoff Qualifying Points are awarded to eligible members of a team, provided that the team contains at least 2 members who are eligible to represent Australia, and that the eligible members have played at least 4 of the 9 rounds and, if applicable, 50% of the boards in the final.

## **ALERTING REGULATIONS**

Opponents must be alerted in accordance with the ABF alerting regulations, as amended to 1998.

#### SYSTEMS AND CONVENTIONS

Pairs must classify their system(s) as GREEN, BLUE, RED or YELLOW using the ABF System Regulations adopted in January 1991 and as modified at May 1998. Pairs in any doubt about the classification of their system should submit a concise summary to the Convenor.

All pairs must supply their opponents with 2 ABF Standard system cards completed adequately to disclose their system.

All systems and conventions, including those categorised as YELLOW, will be permitted in the Open and Womens' Teams (only RED permitted in the Congress Teams) in all rounds and at all levels. Pairs intending to use a YELLOW system must have lodged an adequate system statement on an ABF standard system card, plus a maximum of 2 supplementary A4 sheets, with the Convenor, by November 5<sup>th</sup> 1999.

Pairs intending to use a YELLOW system only against an opposing pair which plays a YELLOW system must lodge a concise system summary with the Chief Tournament Director before the start of the first round of the event in which they wish to use it.

## HOTEL, TRANSPORT AND CAR PARKING INFORMATION

The WYNYARD VISTA Hotel is situated in York Street at the north end of the City, just south of the Harbour Bridge. The ABF has negotiated a special rate for players staying at the hotel: the price is \$130 per double or twin share, room only, plus 10% bed tax. Suites are also available. Other deals including meals and parking may also be available.

For reservations, call 1800 652 090 (interstate toll-free), or (02) 9274 1222. Hotel guest parking is limited, so state your requirements.

The Kingsford Smith bus service operates between the airport and the hotel for a fee of \$6.00.

Public transport is very convenient for local players, with the exit from Wynyard station only 100 metres from the hotel.

The ABF has negotiated a special rate with SUN Parking (was Wilson) at its Kent Street car park (corner of Kent and Margaret Streets). Vouchers will be available from the Convener for **\$16.00** (for all day parking from 7 am until closing). Evening only tickets are available at the car park for **\$5.00**. **The car park is not available at weekends.** It nominally closes at 10 pm, but will remain open until 12 midnight on November 12<sup>th</sup>, and until 11pm from November 15<sup>th</sup>. Reentry is not permitted on one voucher.

Lunch menus will be provided during morning sessions for collection before 12.30 pm. A coffee service will be available (at the players' expense). Bar facilities are available on the ground floor, and from 7.30 pm close to the playing area. Smoking is not permitted on the playing floor, but is permitted in the ground floor bar area.

The hotel has a restaurant on the ground floor, open for lunch and dinner.
