The play was straightforward: draw trumps, cash $\star$ A, $\uparrow$, ditching the $\uparrow 7$, $\boldsymbol{A}$, concede a club and ruff two clubs in dummy later, North-South +980 . That was worth 11 Imps. The auction at the other table:

Declarer made 12 tricks, +620 . South might have passed the double of $5 \boldsymbol{2}$. North would then redouble to show first-round control and maybe $6 \star$ could have been reached.
