West leads the $\$$. Plan the play.
Suppose it goes $\downarrow$ : five - nine - jack. You cash the $\uparrow K$, cross to the $A$ and play the $A$ : three $-\vee 4-\downarrow$. What next?

South was lucky to receive the $\uparrow 4$ opening lead. South would have had no chance on the $\vee Q$ lead. Exactly why West did not choose the $\vee \mathrm{Q}$ is not clear.

South however did not make the most of this good fortune. After $\triangleleft \mathrm{J}, \star \mathrm{K}$, $\mathrm{A}, \stackrel{\mathrm{A}}{ }$, discarding the $\uparrow 4$, South played dummy's $\uparrow 3$. All would have been well if trumps had been 3-2, but with the $4-1$ break, the play of a trump was premature. East won with the $₫ K$, cashed the $\vee$ A and continued with the $\uparrow 10$. If South ruffed low, West would over-ruff. In practice, South ruffed high and West discarded a club. West now had A-9-7 over South's $\boldsymbol{\mathrm { J }}$-10-8-6-5 and was bound to come to two trump tricks. South was thus one down, -50 .
 (loser on loser play. Now there is no promotion and South makes five spades, three diamonds and two clubs.

Results: 4 $+420 \times 4,-50 \times 3 ; 3+140$ and $-50 ; 2 \boldsymbol{a}+110$; North-South $3 N T$ failing $\times 6$.

This was yesterday's problem \#2:
With neither side vulnerable, the auction starts Pass : 1^: Pass : 2^, back to you. What do you do now with

Options include 3\& Michaels, 5 hearts and a $5+$ minor, or a jump to $4 \downarrow$, Leaping Michaels, showing $5+$ hearts and $5+$ diamonds. The problem is that either of these commits you to the 4-level. North chose 2NT, hoping to buy the hand at the 3 -level or push the opponents up to $3 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$. The plan was to remove South's likely $3 \boldsymbol{\varepsilon}$ bid to $3 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$, showing a two-suiter in the red suits. South would be aware that North was a passed hand.

Given that North was below opening strength, there was no pressing need for South to jump to $4 \boldsymbol{\ell}$ with a balanced 10-count. North corrected to $4 \diamond$ and South showed preference with $4 \uparrow$. Had West made the normal lead of the $\uparrow 10$, East-West would collect a spade, two hearts and a diamond. It is hard to know what prompted West to choose the lead.

South won with the J and discarded dummy's 4 on the Declarer played the 2 : eight - ten - jack. East switched to the $\uparrow$, ruffed in dummy. Declarer cashed the $\vee A, \uparrow$ A and ruffed a diamond. Declarer had two hearts to lose, but still made ten tricks, for +420 and +9.2 Imps. Other results: 3^-100x 2; 3^ doubled -100; 3^ $-50 \times 3 ; 4-50 ; 4-50 \times 2 ; 4 \vee-50 ; 2+110 ; 3 \uparrow+140 \times 3 ; 4 \vee-150$.
