There is no defence to $5 \star$. Both Norths led the $₫ \mathrm{~K}$. Both Wests lost just a spade and a heart, making 11 tricks, +550 . In a practice match on BBO, the bidding was identical, except that Jessica Brake, South, did not double 5 and thus gained 4 Imps against the other scores

The Law of Total Tricks did not work out perfectly on this deal: Each side has ten trumps, so Total Trumps 20, but North-South can make 4 and East-West can make $5 \downarrow$, so Total Tricks $=21$. Of course, swap East's $\uparrow 9$ for West's $\$ 9$ and East-West can make only ten tricks in diamonds. The par result is for North-South to bid 54, which if doubled is -100 and gains 10 Imps in the Spingold.

West led the $\boldsymbol{\$}$. East won with the $\boldsymbol{\wedge} \mathrm{K}$ and switched to the $\mathbf{\vee}$. Next came the $\downarrow 6$ from dummy. East won with the $\diamond \mathrm{K}$ and played the $\vee$. South could ruff only three diamonds in dummy and so lost a spade, two diamonds and a club, two down, -300 . That was a reasonable result, as 4 \& is unbeatable.

North led the $\vee 2$. South won with the $\vee$ A and switched to the 9 . North won and reverted to the $\vee K$. West ruffed and played the 9 : two - six - three. That was one down, -100 and 9 Imps to GAUTRET.

Should West overcall 2^? That was yesterday’s second problem. Both Wests did. No doubt East expected a better hand for $2 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$, since he jumped to $5 \boldsymbol{\wedge}$ asking partner to bid $6 \boldsymbol{\downarrow}$ with control in hearts. East was hoping for something like $\uparrow$ Uxxx $\vee \mathrm{x}$ Axx Axxx or better. In a BBO practice match on the same deal, it went $2 \downarrow$ : Pass : 4『 : Double, Pass : 4^, all pass. Declarer made ten tricks for +420 .
