Dealer South : North-South vulnerable

What would you do as South with:

A good test for this kind of problem is this: Are most of your High Card Points in your long suits or in your short suits? If in the long suits, rebid $2 \star$ as here. The hand is not good enough for a $2 \downarrow$ reverse. If most of your points are in your short suits, prefer a 1 NT rebid. For example, after $1 \star: 1 \downarrow$, rebid 1 NT with:

\bullet Q965
* Q9765
& AKQ
```

Not everyone adheres to that, as you will see shortly when the auctions in the original deal (2017 Spingold Round of 16) are given.

When the deal was replayed on BBO, the auction went this way:

(1) Looks right to me
(2) With North's sequence showing shortage in hearts, South does not want to cue-bid $4 \vee$.

West led the $\mathbf{~} 3$ : $2-\vee$ A - . South could draw trumps and finesse in clubs for 12 tricks, +620 .

In the 2017 Spingold Round of 16, with FIREMAN North-South, it went $1 \diamond$ : 1 $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$, $1 \mathrm{NT}: 2 \boldsymbol{2}$ (new minor
 South made a spade, a heart, 5 diamonds and 5 clubs, +690 .

PIEDRA North-South:

(1) Artificial, game-force
(2) Tell me more
(3) 5 diamonds
(4) Spade control
(5) 2 key cards, no $\downarrow$ Q

West led the $\uparrow$ : four - two - jack. Declarer finessed the Q , drew trumps, repeated the club finesse and made 12 tricks, +1370 and +12 Imps.
