Dealer West : Nil vulnerable

What would you do now as South with:

You need to apply whatever methods your partnership has to force to game and, if possible, show strong diamonds as well. Over 1NT, some might bid $2 \downarrow$ (artificial, forcing to game) and repeat the diamonds on the next round. Others might jump to $3 \star$ over 1NT to show that. Susan Humphries (S), playing with Jessica Brake (N), both members of the current Australian Women's Team, found an even more descriptive rebid.

Dealer West : Nil vulnerable

(1) Splinter, 0-1 spades, long diamonds
(2) Sets diamonds as trumps
(3) Cue-bid, first- or second-round heart control

South knew North’s $4 \vee$ cue-bid showed the $\vee$ A since North had rebid 1NT and South was looking at the $¥ K$. West led the $\uparrow 4$, taken by the $\downarrow$. Declarer drew trumps and made 13 tricks when the $¥$ appeared. The $\boldsymbol{J}$ went on the $\uparrow$ K and the Q on the thirteenth heart, North-South +940 .

(2) Cue-bid, diamonds set as trumps

West led a spade, 13 tricks, North-South +940 .
With FIREMAN North-South and East-West passing throughout, it went 1NT : 2NT (transfer to diamonds), 3e (not keen on diamonds) : 3^ (0-1 spade), 3NT : 4 (cue, setting diamonds), 4 (waiting) : 4NT, $5 \downarrow$ ( 2 key cards, no $\downarrow$ Q) : 5 (asking for the $\uparrow$ Q), $6 \star$ ('I do not have it.') : 6 NT , all pass.

East led the $\uparrow$. Declarer cashed the diamonds and the hearts, 13 tricks, +1020 and +2 Imps.
